1. Opening Remarks by Mayor Parrish

Mayor Parrish welcomed the community to the Town Hall meeting and provided a brief overview of the City's proposed Fiscal Year 2020 budget.

2. Citizens' Time

Betsy Reed, a resident of the City of Manassas, voiced her concerns about incidents on her street that required police involvement and inquired how information can be obtained about police involved incidents.

Mike Freeland, a resident of the City of Manassas, inquired about the progress on traffic controls and signal optimization in the City.

Deborah Kunzer, a resident of the City of Manassas, stated that the signs for public hearings need to be larger and the City's website is not easily accessible to find information on public hearings. Ms. Kunzer also voiced her concerns on the heights of buildings in Historic Downtown.

Thomas Osina, a resident of the City of Manassas, suggested it would be beneficial to the community if a Spanish translator was available at City Council meetings. Mr. Osina voiced his concerns on parking in Georgetown South and the opioid crisis, and requested an update on the status of the dog park at Dean Park.

Amalfi Arias, a resident of the City of Manassas, voiced his concerns on overcrowding in homes in the City.

Allen Muchnick, a resident of the City of Manassas, voiced his concerns about public transportation projects and usability of the City's website. Mr. Muchnick proposed a Citizens Transportation Advisory Committee be established for citizens to be more involved in the transportation planning process.

Ed Spall, a resident of the City of Manassas, inquired about what City Council believes are the City's greatest challenges.

Laura Coates, a resident of the City of Manassas, informed the City Council and the community of the Manassas City Rotaract, a community service based group for people ages 18 – 30 years old. Ms. Coates stated next event will be on Wednesday, March 27 from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at Jirani's Coffeehouse.

Patrick Geary, a resident of the City of Manassas, stated he was a new resident in the City and inquired on the potential improvements or development to the E.G. Smith Baseball Complex.
